

CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF NEWMARKET

BYLAW 1990-77

A BYLAW RESPECTING THE FIRING OF GUNS.

BE IT ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Newmarket as follows:

1. No person other than:
 - (a) a police officer in the execution of his duties;
 - (b) a farmer or any of his family residing with him, and upon his own lands;
 - (c) any person alone or with a group of persons, an association, a unit of armed forces, a unit of police or a unit of cadets authorized by a resolution of Council carrying on a display or exhibition

shall fire or discharge any gun or other firearm, airgun, spring gun, or any class or type thereof within the corporate limits of the Town of Newmarket.


2. Every person who contravenes a provision of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) exclusive of costs for each offence.

3. Notwithstanding Paragraph 1 hereof, shooting at clay birds from properly constructed skeet facilities and subject to annual inspection by the divisional Inspector of Police and approval of the Town of Newmarket, shall be permitted in that part of the Town of Newmarket which may be defined as the west half of the south half of Lot 99, Concession 1, west of Yonge Street, Town of Newmarket, provided that such shooting shall be carried on only by the owner of the said lands with his family and guests.


4. Bylaws 1972-4, 1972-14, 1976-35 and 1969-19 are hereby repealed.

READ A FIRST AND SECOND TIME THIS 30 DAY OF APRIL, 1990.

READ A THIRD TIME AND FINALLY PASSED THIS 30 DAY OF APRIL, 1990.
