THANK YOU: RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES!

Thank you to all residents and businesses for hosting the film production crew this past week in the downtown area. Newmarket Council has committed a \$50,000 investment in the downtown focused on Main Street District Business Improvement Area (BIA) and economic development opportunities.

Stay tuned for a new initiative called Random Acts of Downtown that will re-invest revenues from this production into the downtown and support the Main Street BIA businesses impacted.

PHASE 2: WATER METER REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

We are moving onto the second phase of the Mandatory Water Meter Replacement Program that will see water meters replaced for approximately 18,000 households. This work will be done on an area-by-area basis. Those selected will receive a letter in the mail to book an appointment for an in-house water meter exchange with the Town's contractor WAMCO. An adult 18+ years old is required to be home for the duration of the appointment.
