TAKE EXTRA CAUTION AROUND STREAMS, **RIVERS AND STORMWATER PONDS**

Take caution around local bodies of water such as Fairy Lake, the Holland River and storm water ponds. Use extreme caution and advise your children not to skate, fish, swim or toboggan in these areas. Stormwater ponds may look safe but water flow and levels can fluctuate quickly without warning. Please do not skate on stormwater ponds.

NEED EXTRA PARKING THIS WINTER?

The Off-Street Parking program is back! With a permit, you can park in select municipal lots overnight between the hours of 5 p.m. to 7 a.m. while winter parking restrictions are in effect. It's easy:

- 1. Go to our online parking portal
- 2. Put in your vehicle information
- 3. Park in one of four Municipal lots, in a designated spot
- 4. Move your car by 7 a.m.

2022 WASTE AND RECYCLING TIPS

Keep these waste and recycling tips in mind:

- Have all items at the curb by 7 a.m. to ensure pick-up. Do not place items on a snowbank.
- Do no overfill your blue box. Keep materials below the rim to ensure they do not blow away.
- Place heavier recyclable items on top and lighter items on the bottom of your blue box.

PREVENT ENCOUNTERS WITH COYOTES

Prevent encounters with coyotes by removing any food attractants, storing all garbage in sealed containers, using motion sensing lights around your home and ensure spaces around decks/sheds are closed off. If you encounter a coyote, stay calm and back away slowly. Never run or turn your back on a coyote. Report coyote sightings at newmarket.ca/coyotes

SNOW CLEARING OPERATIONS IN NEWMARKET

Newmarket is responsible for clearing 624km of roads during a winter event. Once snowaccumulation is greater than 6cm snow clearing operations will begin starting with primary streets (roads with higher traffic), followed by secondary streets. Once these areas are complete, plows will then move onto courts, elbow and cul-de-sac streets. Please respect our operators as they work to keep the community safe.
