MANDATORY MASKS REQUIREMENTS LIFTED AT FACILITIES

As of **March 21**, masks are no longer required to enter a Newmarket facility in accordance with the Provincial mandates. While masks and face coverings are no longer mandated by Public Health, the Town recognizes the importance of personal choice and encourages those who feel more comfortable wearing a mask in public settings to continue to do so. Residents continue to be encouraged to conduct a self-health assessment prior to visiting. Those with COVID-19 symptoms are asked to stay home until symptoms have subsided.

TAKE CAUTION AROUND LAKES, STREAMS, RIVERS AND STORMWATER PONDS

Take caution around local bodies of water such as Fairy Lake, the Holland River and storm water ponds. Use extreme caution and advise your children not to skate, fish, swim or toboggan in these areas. Stormwater ponds may look safe but water flow and levels can fluctuate quickly without warning. Please do not skate on stormwater ponds.

PARKING AND DISRUPTION NOTICE IN DOWNTOWN DUE TO FILM PRODUCTION

From March 21 to April 3, residents and business around Old Town Hall, Market Square and surrounding areas will experience some parking closures and disruptions due to a large film production. Vehicles parked in closed parking lots/areas for the production will be asked to move their vehicles. Cars found in the lots after this time will be moved to the Riverwalk Commons area parking lot by the Town's contractor at the expense of the production crew.
