ANNUAL WATERMAIN CLEANING PROGRAM

The annual watermain cleaning program has begun and will continue until October. This season's work will focus on uni-directional flushing (UDF) where the watermains are cleaned by flushing sequences of water from one fire hydrant to another. This process is considered to be one of the best ways to preserve high quality water and maintain the reliability of the water distribution system. Work will take place from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and residents can expect minimal service disruption.

Newmarket is home to many wildlife species. Keep these tips in mind so we can all enjoy this community:

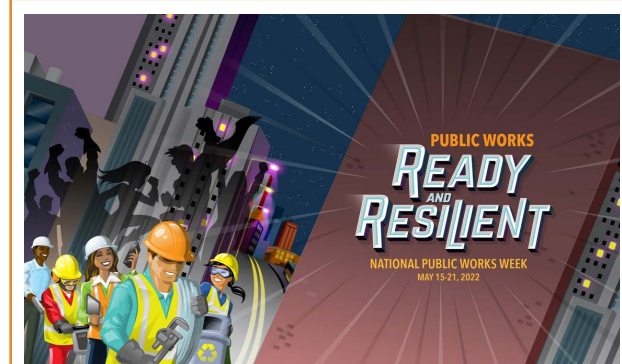
- Please keep your distance and admire them from afar

Grasscycling is the best way to decompose grass clippings. Leave grass clippings on your lawn after mowing. Grass clippings reduce the need for fertilizers by 30% and returns nutrients back to soil to help build healthy roots.
